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Executive Summary

In the second quarter of 2017, Zambia's total trade (exports and imports) increased to US\$3.96 billion from US\$3.31 billion in the corresponding period in 2016. The improvement in trade was on account of an increase in both export and import performance. Exports rebounded due to higher copper exports and non-traditional exports such as salt and sulphur; sugars and confectionery; and inorganic chemicals. Imports also recovered largely on account of higher imports of nuclear reactors and boilers, mineral fuels, copper ores, slag and ash. Switzerland remained the top major destination for Zambia's exports and South Africa is the top major source for Zambia's imports.

1. Introduction

This report analyses Zambia's direction of merchandise trade for the second quarter of 2017 compared with the corresponding quarter in 2016. Statistics, based on the Harmonised Coding System (HS) are reported and exports are valued as free on board (f.o.b.) while imports are reported at cost, including insurance and freight (c.i.f.).

In the second quarter of 2017, Zambia's total trade (exports and imports) was US\$3.96 billion compared to US\$3.31 billion in the corresponding period in 2016.

2. Major Destinations for Zambia's Exports¹




Figure 1 Major Export destinations (USD millions)

Zambia's total exports in Q2-2017 were US\$1.88 billion compared to US1.59 billion in Q2-2016. The top six destinations for Zambia's exports, from highest to lowest, were Switzerland, China, Singapore, Congo DR, South Africa, and the United Arab Emirates (Figure 1). Exports to these coutries accounted for 85.6% of total exports.

Exports to Switzerland rose by 31.7% to US\$847.7million from US\$643.8 million, attributed to an increase in copper earnings from that country (Figure 1).

Likewise, exports to China increased by 12.0% to US\$376.02 million from US\$335.6 million mainly on account of a surge in exports of copper and articles thereof and ores, slag and ash.

Further, exports to Singapore rose to US\$120.5 million from US\$109.7 million on account of an increase in exports of copper and articles thereof.

Exports to Congo (DR) recorded a 6.0% increase to US\$114.9 million from US\$108.3 million on account of small incremental increases in various NTE commodities such as salt, sulphur, plastering material, lime, cement and inorganic chemicals.

Similarly exports to South Africa rose to US\$88.8 million from US\$82.8 million on account of an increase in exports of copper and articles thereof and cultured pearls, precious stones and metals.

On the other hand, exports to the United Arab Emirates declined by 35.9% to US\$62.7 million from US\$97.8 million mainly on account of a reduction in exports of Electrical machinery equipment and parts thereof.

The top five export commodities were copper and articles thereof; salt and Sulphur; sugars and confectionery; inorganic chemicals, and printed books, newspapers and pictures. The country earned US\$1.45 billion from copper


and Zambia's trade with SADC and COMESA countries.

exports compared to US\$1.14 billion in the corresponding quarter in 2016 (Figures 2a and 2b).

Figure 3a: Q2 2016 and Q2 2017 Copper Major Export Destinations (USD Millions)




Figure 3b: Q2 2016 and Q2 2017 Major Export destinations Salt and Sulphur (USD millions)




Figure 3c: Q2 2016 and Q2 2017 Major Export destinations for Sugars and Confectionery (USD millions)




Figure 3e: Q2-2016 and Q2-2017 Major Export destinations for printed books, newspapers, pictures and other products (USD millions)






Figure 3d: Q2-2016 and Q2-2017 Major Export destinations for Inorganic Chemicals (USD millions)



3. Major Source Countries for Zambia's Imports

Merchandise imports in Q2 2017 increased by 21.6 perecent from US\$1.71 billion recorded in Q1 to US\$2.08 billion recorded in Q2 2016. During the review period, the top five source countries for Zambia's imports were: South Africa, Congo DR, China, Kuwait and Mozambique (Figure 4).

Figure 4: Zambia's Q2-2017 Top Source Countries for Imports (USD millions)




Imports from South Africa rose by 2.2% to US\$590.1 million from US\$577.6 million on account of a rise in imports of fertilisers; salt and sulphur; mineral fuels; vehicles and inorganic chemicals.

An increas of 76.5% in imports from Congo DR was recorded to US\$360.3 million from US\$204.1 million on account of an increase in imports of ores, slag and ash; inorganic chemicals and zinc and articles thereof. Imports from China rose by 129.0% to US\$308.1 from US\$134.5 million on account of a rise in imports of nuclear reactors and boiler; aviation equipment and Electrical machinery and parts thereof.

Correspondingly, imports from Mozambique increased by more than seven times to US\$102.2 million from US\$13.2 million largely attributed to an increase in imports of fertilisers from that country. Conversely, imports from Kuwait declined to US\$149.6 million from US\$151.8 million on account of a decrease in the imports of mineral fuels.

Zambia's top five import commodities were: nuclear reactors and boilers (US\$332.6 million); mineral fuels, oils and products of their distillation (US\$270.0 million); ores, slag and ash (US\$249.9million); fertilisers (US\$140.4 million); and inorganic chemicals (US\$126.5 million).





Figure 6d: Source countries for fertilizers (USD millions)

4. Conclusion

During the period under review exports performance improved largely on account of an increase in exports of copper and nontraditional exports such as salt and sulphur; sugars and confectionery; inorganic chemicals and printed books, newspapers and pictures. Copper exports increased due to an increase in both volumes of copper exports and realized prices. On a similar account imports rebounded largely on account of imports of nuclear reactors and boilers, mineral fuels, oils and products of their distillation, and ores, slag and ash.
